## **ELIGIBILITY CERTIFICATE**

- The applicant who has passed the prescribed qualifying examination from recognized Boards of examination that are situated outside Karnataka or in a Foreign country shall compulsorily obtain the ELIGIBILITY CERTIFICATE before taking the admission.
  - Such candidates may apply by online (Seva Sindhu) for the Eligibility Certificates to the KSLU by paying necessary fees along with documents of 10th and 12th Std as applicable along with transcripts issued by the concerned Board or Department.
  - The Eligibility Certificate will be issued through online by the KSLU, Hubballi for those candidates who have obtained their qualifying certificate outside the Karnataka state and all the foreign candidates/applicants.
  - The qualifying certificates should be in Kannada or English only.
  - All those candidates who have obtained qualifying certificate from outside the Karnataka state should produce the countersigned original certificates from the issuing authorities, otherwise eligibility will not be considered.

#### 3) ADMISSION PROCEDURE

- a) Admission to the course shall be made strictly on the basis of merit. While making admission to the course <u>reservation policy</u> of the Government of Karnataka governing admissions to higher educational institutions issued from time to time shall be observed.
- b) 2 seats under supernumerary quota shall be reserved for the Jammu and Kashmir students within the sanctioned intake until the last date of admission as per the orders of Govt. of India.
- C) 5% of seats shall be reserved for the Kashmiri Migrants until the last date of admission as per the orders of Govt. of India, Dept. of HRD, New-Delhi. The persons claiming the status of Kashmiri Migrants should produce the identity card issued by the Jurisdictional Deputy Commissioner and District Magistrate of the Government of Karnataka to this effect.
- d) Reservation for Hyderabad Karnataka students under Art 371(J) as per rules shall be adhered to 8% of the seats shall be reserved for them.
- e) 3% of seats shall be reserved for physically challenged students as per rules applicable.
- f) 5% of seats shall be reserved for Gadinadu/horanadu Kannadiga (Those studied 1 to 10 std. in kannada medium from the outside Karnataka state)

#### 4) FEES

- a) All Principals are strictly instructed to collect the fees as prescribed by the University and Government of Karnataka.
- b) The college shall apply to concerned District Social Welfare/BCM Department for the reimbursement of SC/ST/OBC student's fees.

#### 5) INTAKE

No College shall admit the students in excess of the sanctioned intake.

#### 6) THE COLLEGE AUTHORITY SHOULD VERIFY -

- a) The eligibility of the students as per BCI rules & KSLU admission regulations before admitting the students to the courses.
- b) The students shall be asked to produce the Migration and Transfer Certificates within one month from date of admission.
- c) In case of applicants from Foreign Universities/Boards, the applicant should have obtained the valid passport, visa, Residential permit, and "Students Study Permission/NOC" from Foreign Embassies of both the nations. They should also obtain a certificate that the degree is obtained from a recognized Board/University from the concerned embassy in India.
- d) In case of applicants from Foreign Universities/Boards, the applicant shall be asked to produce the "Equivalence Certificate" issued by the Association of Indian Universities (AIU), New Delhi if necessary.
- e) At the time of documents verification by University for admission approval, the college should submit the originals of above documents & 'Eligibility Certificate' (wherever applicable).
- f) The Principal of the college shall verify the original documents and attest the copies thereof.
- g) The Principal of colleges should certify that the admissions (for all classes) of course/s are made as per the admission rules of Karnataka State Law University, Hubballi and Government of Karnataka.
- h) In case a student is an employee either in State/Central/Private organization, he shall submit a study permission letter from concerned employer stating that the working hours do not conflict with college timings and the Principal should certify that the candidate is capable of attending 70% of classes.

## 7) THE COLLEGE AUTHORITIES SHALL ENSURE SUBMISSION OF THE NECESSARY DOCUMENTS BY THE APPLICANT TO THE COLLEGE, AS BELOW.

- a) The Eligibility Certificate issued by the University, in case of Non-Karnataka and Foreign students at the time of admission.
- b) 10th Std. marks card & P.U.C./12th Std/H.S.C. or any equivalent examination marks cards in case of 5 years LL.B. admission, at the time of admission.
- c) The Transfer & Migration Certificates shall be submitted by student to the college at the time of admission or within one month from the date of admission to the college.
- d) In case of SC/ST/Cat-1/OBC student, Caste & Income certificate shall be submitted by student to the college at the time of admission.

#### STATEMENT OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

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Act 8 of 2006.- It is considered necessary to provide for regulation of admission and determination of fee in professional educational institutions in the State of Karnataka and to provide for reservation of seats to persons belonging to the Scheduled Castes, the Scheduled Tribes and Other Backward Classes in professional educational institutions.

The Hon'ble Supreme Court in its judgement in Islamic Academy of Education and others Vs State of Karnataka, reported in (2003) 6 SCC 697, sought to regulate admissions to professional courses through two committees, one for overseeing admissions and the other for approving the fee structure in professional educational institutions, pending enactment of appropriate law by the Parliament.

**9. Allocation and reservation of seats.-** Out of the total intake of seats in a professional educational institution,-

- (i) (a) in an aided institution, all Government seats shall be filled through the State Common Entrance Test Committee in accordance with section 3(6) subject to the reservation policy of the State Government; and
- (b) the remaining seats shall be general seats.
- (ii) (a) in an unaided non-minority institution fifty percent of the seats shall be reserved for candidates belonging to the Scheduled Castes, the Scheduled Tribes and Other Backward Classes from the State as notified by the State Government; and
  - (b) the remaining seats shall be general category seats. Out of the general category seats upto fifteen percent may be filled by candidates belonging to the Non-Resident Indian quota: <sup>1</sup>[and fifty percent of the remaining seats shall be filled by the Karnataka students]<sup>1</sup>

Provided that where the seats reserved for the Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and Other Backward Classes in an unaided non minority institution are left unfilled due to non-availability of the candidates, or where students of reserved categories leave after they select the seats, the same shall be filled by the candidates belonging to the same category out of the merit list of the Common Entrance Test conducted by the <sup>2</sup>[State Common Entrance Test Committee or Common Entrance Test conducted by the Government of India or its agency as the case may be.]<sup>2</sup>

Provided further that if seats are remain unfilled even thereafter, such unfilled seats shall be filled from the student belonging to general merit on the basis of merit through the Common Entrance Test <sup>3</sup>[XXX]<sup>3</sup>

- (iii) (a) In an unaided minority professional educational institution, not less than sixty six percent of the seats shall be filled by minority students from within the State belonging to the minority community to which the institution belongs on the basis of interse merit in the merit list of the Common Entrance Test <sup>3</sup>[XXX]<sup>3</sup>; and
  - (b) the remaining seats shall be the general category seats. Out of the general category seats, upto fifteen percent may be filled by candidates belonging to the Non-Resident Indian Quota <sup>1</sup>[and fifty percent of the remaining seats shall be filled by the Karnataka students]<sup>1</sup>

Provided that if any seats earmarked for the minority category in unaided institutions remain unfilled or where the students leave after selection of seat the same shall be filled by minority students of the same categories out of the merit list of the Common Entrance Test conducted by the State Common Entrance Test Committee <sup>1</sup>[or the Government of India or its agency as the case may be]<sup>1</sup>:

Provided further that if seats are remain unfilled even thereafter, such unfilled seats shall be filled from the student belonging to general merit on the basis of merit through the Common Entrance Test <sup>3</sup>[XXX]<sup>3</sup>

- (iv) Admission to all seats in a private unaided professional educational institutions including reserved or general category seats but excluding the seats which may be filled by Non-resident Indian candidates, shall be made on the basis of merit by following the procedure of Common Entrance test followed by centralized counseling conducted in the manner as <sup>2</sup>[as may be prescribed]<sup>2</sup>
