PROCESS AND ANALYSIS OF CURRICULUM FEEDBACK FROM VARIOUS STAKE HOLDERS



Feedback and action taken – Teachers		
Sl. No.	Feedback	Action taken
1	The curriculum can provide for sufficient elective papers	The college has taken initiative to conduct an evaluation of the course structure and syllabus of the 5 year integrated undergraduate programmes as the curriculum is prescribed by the Karnataka State Law University, Hubballi. The course teachers were directed to submit the proposal for revision of the syllabus. The academic evaluation committee headed by Prof. (Dr.) Rose Varghese collected, reviewed and consolidated the suggestion for the revision of the syllabus and the same was submitted to the University for its perusal.
2	Enough freedom to contribute my ideas on curriculum design and development	Though the curriculum is designed by the University, the Institution instructs the faculty members to compile the recent case laws, articles retaining to their subjects so that it helps in the effective delivery of the syllabus.

Feedback and action taken - Students		
Sl. No.	Feedback	Action taken
1	Exposure to latest developments in the field of law	Internships, legal awareness programme, webinars provide the students with the latest development in the field of law.
2	The course contains adequate course content and reference material	Complied recent case laws, articles, reading materials is shared with the students. A copy of the same is also available in the library.
3	Experiential learning	Seminars, debates, moot court trainings are also organized to bridge the gap between theory and practice. Assignment writing, seminars, tests are conducted as a part of course requirement.
4	Time provided to complete the syllabus is adequate	The university prescribes the duration for semester. Extra session will be handled by the faculty members to support the slow learners.
5	The curriculum to develop intellectual skills	Assignment, seminars, role play, debates, GD, cooperative teaching, guidance to the students to publish articles.

Feedback and action taken - Alumni		
Sl. No.	Feedback	Action taken
1	Revision of syllabus and foundational subjects have to be split and offered over the course of multiple semesters. The list of optional subjects needs to be revised such that certain fundamental subjects are made mandatory that would help in strengthening the foundations.	Though the curriculum is prescribed by the University, the institution recommends revision and updation of syllabus according to the contemporary requirements.
2	Need to bridge the gap between theory and practice	The Institution addresses this challenge by organizing internships, orientation programme, moot court, placement training, workshops, debates, seminars, guest lectures. One hour is scheduled for practical session for every subject.
3	Provide career guidance and motivate for higher education	The faculty fraternity motivate the students to attend the virtual career guidance sessions hosted by reputed agencies to explore the future opportunities. As a part of mentorship program, the mentors inspire and guide the mentee to take up higher education and suggest the trending fields of law.



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
