

**ADMISSION PROCEDURE FOR B.A., LL.B
(5 Year Integrated Course) LEADING TO
BACHELORS DEGREE IN LAW UNDER THE
SEMESTER SCHEME**

THE COURSE & DURATION

- (a) Five years B.A., LL.B. integrated degree course in law.
- (b) The duration of the B. A., LL. B. course shall be five academic years consisting of ten semesters.
- (c) Each Academic Year shall be divided into Two Semesters.
- (d) Each Semester shall consist of 18 weeks.
- (e) The papers and the Syllabus shall be as given in the Schedule appended to these Regulations.

ELIGIBILITY CERTIFICATE

- The applicant who has passed the prescribed qualifying examination from recognized University/Boards of examination that are situated outside Karnataka or in a Foreign country shall compulsorily obtain the ELIGIBILITY CERTIFICATE before taking the admission.
- Such candidates may apply for the Eligibility Certificates to the KSLU with necessary original documents in the prescribed form through the college by post or in person by paying necessary fees, to the office of K.S.L.U., Hubballi along with all original marks cards of 10th, 12thStd & U.G, as applicable along with transcripts issued by the concerned University or Board or Department.
- The Eligibility Certificate will be issued by the KSLU Academic Section at Hubballi for those candidates who have obtained their qualifying degree/ certificate outside the Karnataka state and all the foreign candidates/applicants.
- The qualifying degree/ certificates should be in Kannada or English only.
- All those candidates who have obtained qualifying certificate from outside Karnataka state should produce the countersigned original certificates from the issuing authorities/ universities, otherwise eligibility will not be considered.
- Fees for Eligibility certificate shall be paid as prescribed by the University.

ADMISSION GUIDELINES**5 Year Integrated BA.LL.B Course**

- ❖ (a) An applicant who has successfully completed Pre-University course or Senior Secondary School course ('+2') or equivalent such as (11+1, 'A' level in Senior School Leaving Certificate Course) from a recognized University of India or outside or from Senior Secondary Board or equivalent, constituted or recognized by the Union or by the State Government or from any equivalent institution from a foreign country recognized by the government of that country for the purpose of issue of qualifying certificate on successful completion of the course, may apply for and be admitted into the course.
- ❖ Provided that applicants who have obtained +2 Higher Secondary Pass Certificate or First Degree Certificate after prosecuting studies in distance or correspondence method shall also be considered as eligible for admission to this course.

Explanation

The Applicant who has passed the prescribed minimum qualification in a single sitting examination is not eligible for admission to 5 Yr. LL.B Law Course of KSLU, Hubballi.

- ❖ Provided further that the applicants who have obtained 10+2 or graduation or post graduation through open Universities system directly without having any basic qualification for prosecuting such studies are not eligible for admission to the course.
- ❖ (b) Minimum percentage of marks in qualifying examination shall not be below 45% (44.5% and above shall be treated as 45%) of total marks in case of general category applicants and 40% (39.5% and above shall be treated as 40%) of total marks in case of SC and ST applicants.

ALL SUBSEQUENT YEAR (CLASSES) OF ALL LAW COURSES:

- a) The Principal shall verify the promotional eligibility of the students for admission to next class/year of the course. In this regard principal has to enclose the certificate stating that, the student has fulfilled the promotional eligibility criteria for the course.
- b) The admissions for subsequent years shall be made as per Admission Time Table enclosing all previous semester marks cards.

- c) The Statement of admission in proforma-1 & 2 shall be submitted to the K.S.L.U. on the dates mentioned in Academic Calendar
- d) The consolidated admission statements in A4 size papers shall be bound into a single booklet along with the covering letter (with details of fee paid) & shall be addressed to the Registrar, Karnataka State Law University, Hubballi, and be submitted at the time of original document verification.
- e) Incomplete applications shall be liable to be rejected.

ADMISSION PROCEDURE

- a) Admission to the course shall be made strictly on the basis of merit. While making admission to the course reservation policy of the Government of Karnataka governing admissions to higher educational institutions issued from time to time shall be observed.
- b) 2 seats under supernumerary quota shall be reserved for the Jammu and Kashmir students within the sanctioned intake until the last date of admission as per the orders of Govt. of India.
- c) 5% of seats shall be reserved for the Kashmiri Migrants until the last date of admission as per the orders of Govt. of India, Dept. of HRD, New-Delhi. The persons claiming the status of Kashmiri Migrants should produce the identity card issued by the Jurisdictional Deputy Commissioner and District Magistrate of the Government of Karnataka to this effect.
- d) Reservation for Hyderabad – Karnataka students under Art 371(J) as per rules shall be adhered to 8% of the seats shall be reserved for them.
- e) 3% of seats shall be reserved for physically challenged students as per rules applicable.

INTAKE

- (a) The intake for studies in Law, under the jurisdiction of Karnataka State Law University, shall be 120.
- (b) The University shall reserve the right to prescribe the number of divisions in each Law College or Department of Studies in Law.
- (c) As sanctioned by the University maximum of 120 students divided into two sections of 60 students each are admitted.

VERIFICATION DONE BY THE COLLEGE AUTHORITY -

- a) The eligibility of the students as per BCI rules & KSLU admission regulations before admitting the students to the courses.
- b) The students shall be asked to produce the Migration and Transfer Certificates within one month from date of admission.
- c) In case of applicants from Foreign Universities/Boards, the applicant should have obtained the valid passport, visa, Residential permit, and "Students Study Permission/NOC" from Foreign Embassies of both the nations. They should also obtain a certificate that the degree is obtained from a recognized Board/ University from the concerned embassy in India.
- d) In case of applicants from Foreign Universities/Boards, the applicant shall be asked to produce the "Equivalence Certificate" issued by the Association of Indian Universities (AIU), New Delhi if necessary.
- e) At the time of documents verification by University for admission approval, the college should submit the originals of above documents & 'Eligibility Certificate' (wherever applicable).
- f) The Principal of the college shall verify the original documents and attest the copies thereof.
- g) The Principal of colleges should certify that the admissions (for all classes) of course/s are made as per the admission rules of Karnataka State Law University, Hubballi and Government of Karnataka.
- h) In case a student is an employee either in State/Central/Private organization, he shall submit a study permission letter from concerned employer stating that the working hours do not conflict with college timings and the Principal should certify that the candidate is capable of attending 75% of classes

THE COLLEGE AUTHORITIES SHALL ENSURE SUBMISSION OF THE NECESSARY DOCUMENTS BY THE APPLICANT TO THE COLLEGE, AS BELOW.

- a) The Eligibility Certificate issued by the University, in case of Non-Karnataka and Foreign students (5 year B.A., LL.B. courses), at the time of admission.

- b) 10th Std. marks card & P.U.C. /12thStd. / H.S.C. or any equivalent examination marks cards in case of 5 years LL.B. admission, at the time of admission
- c) The Transfer & Migration Certificates shall be submitted by student to the college at the time of admission or within one month from the date of admission to the college.
- d) In case of SC/ST/Cat-1/0BC student, Caste & Income certificate shall be submitted by student to the college at the time of admission.

CURRICULA

- a. Candidates admitted to the Five Year B. A., LL. B. course shall have to attend 10 Semester courses spread over 5 years.
- b. In each Semester, the students shall have to study the courses prescribed by the University in these Regulations.
- c. The course descriptions shall be, as set out from time to time, in the Schedule.

MEDIUM OF INSTRUCTION

The medium of instruction in the Five Year B. A., LL. B. degree course shall be English. However, the examinees shall have the option to answer the question papers in the examination either in English or in Kannada.

ATTENDANCE

- a. No student shall be permitted to appear for the end-of-semester examination in a given course unless he/she has, to the satisfaction of the course teacher, fulfilled the course requirements and has put in not less than 70% attendance in the course concerned.
- b. Provided that a student who has attended not less than 65% of classes in each of the subjects prescribed may be permitted to keep the term for reasons to be recorded in writing and to the satisfaction of the Principal of the College.

PROHIBITION AGAINST LATERAL ENTRY AND EXIT

There shall be no lateral entry on the plea of graduation in any subject or exit by way of awarding a degree splitting the integrated double degree course, at any intermediary stage of integrated double degree course.

PROMOTION

(a) A student who passes in minimum two subjects from either one semester of the academic year or from two semesters of the academic year, shall be eligible for promotion to next class.

(b) Students are required to successfully complete the entire course within ten years from admission to the course.

AWARD OF THE DEGREE

A student shall be eligible for the award of the B. A., LL. B. (Bachelor of Arts and Laws) Degree after he/she has successfully completed all the prescribed courses in all the semesters and his or her character and conduct are found to be satisfactory during the course.

AWARD OF CLASSES

The award of classes shall be as under:

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| a) 70% and more | First Class with Distinction |
| b) 60% and above but less than 70% | First Class |
| c) 50% and above but less than 60% | Second Class |
| d) 40% and above but less than 50% | Pass Class |

SYLLABUS

The Syllabus shall be prescribed by the University from time to time.

SCHEME OF EXAMINATION

There shall be a semester examination at the end of six months. The Examination in each Paper shall be for a maximum of one hundred marks and shall be for three hours.

TEACHING HOURS

Each paper shall be taught for 6 + 2 hours in a week devoting 6 hours for theory and 2 hours for seminar/tutorial.
