ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA FOR ADMISSION

- An Admission Process Review Committee (APRC) comprising of the Director (Academics), the Principal, Faculty Co-ordinators and the administrative office in-charge will supervise and approve the admission through a selection process.
- A candidate belonging to the General Category with minimum 45% marks and above and (in case of SC/ST 40%) at the 10+2 level, will be eligible for the selection process. The students who have appeared for 10+2 and are awaiting results may also apply and their admission is subject to successful completion of the qualifying exam.
- After submission of the duly filled Application Form for Registration, the applicants who have secured less than 50% for the qualifying examination will have to appear for the RCL admission test. The test will be held online at the RCL Computer Centre. The dates and time of the test will be intimated to the candidates subsequently. After the test, the candidate has to go through a telephonic / personal interview with the Director (Academics), Ramaiah College of Law.
- Those applicants who have secured marks above 50% at the qualifying examination will have to mandatorily appear for the telephonic/personal interview with the Director (Academics), Ramaiah College of Law.
- The students who have appeared for the CLAT examination will have the option to exempt themselves from taking the RCL admission test provided they have secured 50% or above in the CLAT. However, appearing for the interview is mandatory.
- The students who are successful in the interview will be required to fill the Application Form for Admission which will be mailed to them from the Administrative Office.
- The candidates have to submit their Admission Form within one week from the date of intimation from the office along with the fee for the First Year. The fee is to be paid through Demand Draft / NEFT / RTGS.
- A fee concession of 05% will be given for SC/ST students from Karnataka for the first year only.
- Scholarship: In order to encourage meritorious students a Scholarship scheme has been introduced for the Academic Year, 2022-23. This will be given as an Institutional Scholarship. The Scholarship is given in the form of Fee Concession which is Rs. 10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand) for the students who have secured 90% marks and above in the aggregate in the qualifying Examination [12th or 2nd PUC]. This Fee Concession is restricted to the first-year fee only.
- The Candidates have to mention their Registration number at the time of interview and in every transaction including the fee transactions, mentioning the specific Course for which admission is sought.

ELIGIBILITY CERTIFICATE

- The applicant who has passed the prescribed qualifying examination from recognized University/Boards of examination that are situated outside Karnataka i.e., ICSE and other state Boards or in a Foreign country shall compulsorily obtain the ELIGIBILITY CERTIFICATE.
- Such candidates may apply for the Eligibility Certificates to the KSLU through the College with necessary original documents with prescribed fee.

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA FOR ADMISSION

- Admission to the first year of the LL.M program, in all P.G . Departments/Law School/ Autonomous Colleges under the jurisdiction of Karnataka State Law University, is strictly based on merit, based on the marks secured by the candidate in the qualifying examination.
- An applicant who has graduated in law from a University established by an Act of Parliament or by a State Legislature or an equivalent National Institution recognized as a Deemed to be University or foreign University recognized by as equivalent to the status of an Indian University by an authority competent to declare equivalence, may apply for the LL.M Degree Course.
- The minimum percentage of marks in the qualifying examination shall not be below 45% of total marks in case of general category applicants and 40% of total marks in case of SC and ST applicants.

Intake and Reservation

- The maximum intake is 20 students in each branch. The University shall reserve the right to prescribe the number of Branches in each Law College or the Department of Studies in Law. While admitting candidates to the Course, the reservation policy of the Government of Karnataka governing admission to higher Educational Institutions issued from time to time, shall be applied.

Fee Structure

- A candidate seeking admission to the LL.M program and those admitted to such Courses shall pay the tuition and other fees as prescribed by the University from time to time.

Course Structure

- At present, the University has launched LL.M in Intellectual Property Rights and Constitutional Law in Karnataka State Law University's Law School and LL.M in Business and Trade Law in the affiliated P.G Department

COLLABORATIONS

- **MOU with Surana & Surana International Attorney, Chennai**

Ramaiah College of Law and Surana & Surana International Attorney, Chennai have entered into an MOU for conducting the International Essay Writing Competition and the National Tort Law Moot Court Competition.

- **Ramaiah College of Law - Ramaiah Public Policy Center [RPPC]**

RCL and RPPC has entered into a Memorandum of Understanding to collaborate and undertake activities and programs on data organization, analysis and interpretation for policy and assessment. The MOU also enables conducting joint research activities and Certificate programs.

- **Collaboration with Karnataka State Legal Services Authority**

RCL has collaborated with the Karnataka State Legal Services Authority to organize legal aid and legal awareness camps both within and outside the college premises. Through this collaboration, students of RCL have the opportunity to work on various research projects.

- **MOU with National Law School of India University (NLSIU)**

Gokula Education Foundation (GEF) which runs RCL has entered into a Memorandum of Understanding

(MOU) with the National Law School of India University (NLSIU), Bengaluru, one among the premier legal education Institutions in the country for an academic collaboration which includes conduct of bridge courses, training programmes and other academic activities.

- **MOU for coaching students for CS Foundation**

RCL has entered into a tie-up with Aavid Education to provide coaching to its students for CS Foundation and such other Courses as may be mutually agreed upon. Through this collaboration, students of RCL will have the opportunity to prepare for the Company Secretary Examination even as they pursue their graduation in Law.

- **Student Support Mentorship Programme**

To provide guidance, pragmatic advice and continuing support to students, Ramaiah College of Law has introduced the mentorship program which will help students in their learning and development process. The mentors interact with students on a regular basis. This helps them in identifying the problems faced by the students so as to address them effectively.

CELLS & CENTRES

1. **Internal Quality Assurance Cell**

The Institution has established an Internal Quality Assurance Cell to plan, supervise and facilitate the institutional functioning towards quality enhancement. It is a significant administrative body responsible for developing a system for conscious, consistent and catalytic action to improve the academic and administrative performance of the institution.

2. **Ramaiah IPR Cell (KSCST-RIPRC)**

KSCST RIPRC RCL has been nominated as the nodal agency for the Ramaiah IPR Cell in Collaboration

with Karnataka State Council for Science & Technology. This collaboration will facilitate IP awareness & rights especially for marginalized groups, besides undertaking projects in this significant area of law.

3. **CENTRE FOR HUMAN RIGHTS, IHL AND REFUGEE LAWS**

The Centre for Human Rights, IHL and Refugee Laws was established in September 2020, with the aim of creating social awareness about issues relating to Human Rights, IHL and Refugee Law. The focus is on undertaking research in core areas of the said

subject with the active participation of students. The core objectives of the Centre are to create social awareness and to disseminate the subject to the legal fraternity and to society at large. Further the centre aims at interns and to undertake projects on contemporary issues relating to the subject so as to promote research in the area, for an appraisal of the situation both in India and Globally.

4. CENTRE FOR WOMEN AND CHILD WELFARE POLICY

The Centre for Women and Child Welfare Policy was established in November 2020. The Centre works towards the development of Women and Children. The Centre functions with a set of basic objectives such as to create social awareness about the problems relating to women and children, to educate women about the existing welfare policies, to undertake research on contemporary issues with respect to Women and Child Welfare and to initiate projects to promote the advancement of women and children.

5. THE CENTRE / ALTERNATE DISPUTE RESOLUTION

The Centre for Legal Aid and Alternative Dispute Resolution Studies works with the objective of creating legal awareness and promoting studies on resolution of disputes through Alternative Dispute resolution mechanisms. Formerly, the activities of the Centre was carried through the Legal Aid Clinic and ADR Society respectively. It aims at creating awareness, bringing out publications, organizing seminars/workshops and undertaking research projects in collaboration with the industry, Bar

Council of India, State Bar Councils and individual experts on issues pertaining to ADR.

6. LEGAL SERVICES CLINIC, RCL

RCL has set up a full-fledged Legal Services Clinic and works in close collaboration with the Karnataka State Legal Services Authority.

INTERNSHIP AND PLACEMENT CELL

The Placement and Internship Committee of the Institution envisions that the students of RCL shall use their skills gained in the law school to learn, gain experience and create an impact in society with regard to their internships during their times in law school or their placement post law school. The Committee intends to create a platform for students to obtain meaningful internship opportunities during their time in the law school; and create opportunities for their placement in a variety of fields and the various avenues open to the law graduates.

Along with the regular academic activities, the Institution strives to contribute to research in the field of law. The Institution has its own journal, M.S. Ramaiah Journal of Law (MSRJL). A trendsetter journal of law, it seeks to encourage the analysis of law and impact its evolution.



COMMITTEES AND CLUBS

• MOOT COURT COMMITTEE

The Ramaiah College of Law Moot Court Committee works to foster a vibrant and dynamic mooting culture in the College by upholding high standards of excellence in the field of mooting. We facilitate, regulate and foster the mooting and allied activities of the College so as to mould and sharpen the oral advocacy, research and legal drafting skills of the students. The students are encouraged to demonstrate their interest in advocacy and competence as an advocate to prospective employers. The committee works closely with the students to aid them to become excellent mooters and thereby, professionally-competent and socially-committed lawyers.

The Committee selects the students for representing the College in various national and international Moot Court Competitions through the Intra Moot Competition conducted every year and provides them with sufficient support to participate in various competitions.

Further, in appropriate subjects, the pedagogy includes holding Moot Courts in the classroom on crucial areas.

LITERARY AND DEBATING SOCIETY

The college has a Debate Society, popularly known as "DebSoc" to introduce students to various debating forums. It's a forum for all those who find passion in putting forward their ideologies. They are responsible for encouraging students to participate in various national and international debate, Model United Nation, Parliamentary Debate etc.

The objective of the RCL Technology and Science Law Club is to accustom the students to the areas of law which have an interface with science and technology

and to bring in the interdisciplinary approach of learning in legal curriculum. The areas of research and study of the Club includes Intellectual Property Rights, Cyber Laws, interdisciplinary areas like Law and Medicine, Law and Forensic Science, Law and Biotechnology, Law and AI and Food and Agricultural Laws.

RCL PODCAST COMMITTEE

With the transforming dimensions in education, the RCL Podcast Committee aims to integrate classroom learnings with podcasts to disperse assorted insights into how things learnt in class usually shape up when put in practice.

INFRASTRUCTURE AND FACILITIES

The college has its own building with well equipped classrooms. The building has an auditorium where the regular Seminars are being conducted and guest lectures are organised. The building also contains a Moot Court Hall, a spacious Library, Computer laboratory and students common rooms.

- **MOOT COURT HALL**

The College has a well-furnished Moot Court hall to conduct intra and inter Moot Court competitions. The faculty members take the responsibility in training the students for National and International Moot Court Competitions.

- **LIBRARY**

The college has a well-equipped library with state-of-the-art facilities and over 10,000 law books including textbooks and reference books. Additionally, the college subscribes to periodicals, law journals and national and international law reports. Students are provided with the facility to borrow or photocopy the study material. The college library also has an "Institutional Membership" with National Law School of India University, Bengaluru.

- **LANGUAGE LAB**

Language lab classes will be conducted for the students of the 1st and 2nd year BBA LL.B, BCOM LL.B AND BA LL.B courses. These classes are specifically designed for students who need help in improving their language skills. These classes will aim to conduct activities that will help improve their speaking and writing skills.

- **COMPUTER LAB**

The college has a computer lab with more than 50 Desktops with internet facilities to enable students to enrich their knowledge with modern technology and access to online legal databases such as Manupatra and Westlaw for legal research.



- **ACCESS TO PARENT & STUDENT ON-LINE INFORMATION SYSTEM**

The college has an on-line student information system to enable the parents to know their wards' academic performance. Results of tests, assignment scores and attendance details of students are regularly uploaded on the portal which can be easily accessed.

- **SPORTS COMPLEX**

The college encourages students to take part in extracurricular activities. students of RCL have always been selected and represented in University level sports tournaments and have brought accolades to the college. There is a sports complex on the campus for all indoor and outdoor games.






